Mississippi is honored to have National President Gerald Franklin represent The National Exchange Club at our 2001 District Convention. Franklin, a member of the Heights Exchange Club of Houston, Texas, the Exchange Club of the Galleria-Houston, Texas, and the Exchange Club of Bellaire, Texas, was installed as national

president of The National Exchange Club at the organization's annual convention in Phoenix, AZ, in July 2000. He is the owner and president of the Gerald Franklin Agency, a beverage licenses service based in Houston.

Franklin, who joined Exchange in 1969, chaired numerous club committees and served as treasurer of the Exchange Club of the Galleria-Houston club before being named club president for 1974-75. He was elected treasurer of the Texas District Exchange Clubs in 1975, district president-elect a year later, and district president in 1977.

A former member of the board of trustees of The National Exchange Club Foundation for the Prevention of Child Abuse, he also served as founding chairman of the board of the Exchange Club Center for the Prevention of Child Abuse of Houston. For the National Exchange Club, Franklin served as regional vice president, Region 5, for two terms before being elected national president-elect in 1999.

National President Franklin is also very active in his community. He has served as director and board chairman of the Harris Unit-American Trauma Society, and has also been involved with the Houston Chamber of Commerce, the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo, and the Houston International Festival Foundation. The Exchange Club of Magic Circle honored him as Outstanding Exchangite in 1972.

Franklin attended Sam Houston University, Huntsville, Texas, graduating with a bachelor of business administration degree. He and his wife Evelyn reside in Houston, TX.



NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, hereby proclaim April 2001 as

"CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH"

in the State of Mississippi and I urge all citizens to use this time to better understand, recognize and respond to this grievous problem;

AND, FURTHER I congratulate the Exchange Clubs of Mississippi for their continued success in helping families eliminate abuse from their lives.
